Rev. Basil George Scott is an Associate Pastor of First Baptist Church of Annapolis, Maryland. He is also the Pastor of the Children's Church, where he preaches captivating messages to the children every second and third Sundays in each month.

Rev. Scott is a graduate of Washington Bible College in Lanham, Maryland. He studied at Lynchburg University, and Robert Schuller Institute in the area of "Successful Church Leadership."

Rev. Scott was the Founder of "Good Hope Through Grace Ministry", a television ministry, which ran for 27 years, and was seen every Sunday at 8:00 p.m. on Channel 99 (Comcast) or on Channel 39 (Verizon), the Anne Arundel Public Television Station. These plays include: "The Trial of Jesus", "The Dispensations of the Bible", "The Woman At The Well", "The Blind Man" and others.

Rev. Scott is from Saint Ann, Jamaica. He has lived in the United States for forty-seven years and has been a member of First Baptist Church for 46 years. His sister, Mrs. Avril Johnson, has also been a member of First Baptist Church for over 46 years. Rev. Scott is married to Deaconess Pearlina Scott, who is the Director of First Baptist Children's Church.

They have two grown daughters namely, Mrs. Renee Creese and Ms. Stacey Scott, Esq. They are blessed with two granddaughters, Madison and Riley Creese and a son-in-law, named Niegel Creese.
